




Figure 3.45 Superficial spreading melanoma has characteristic asymmetry, irregular borders and multiple colors.






Figure 3.46 Nodular melanoma: (a) with characteristic blue-black pigmentation; (b) developed within a dysplastic nevus, with Breslow thickness 1.2 mm; (c) a combined nodular and superficial spreading melanoma.
